At sixteen, Fannie Belle Fleming became Blaze Starr, The Stripper.

Blaze Starr rose to fame at the Two O' Clock Club in Baltimore, Maryland and achieved national notoriety when featured in Esquire magazine in 1954.

Blaze Starr's striptease act included a panther she trained to undress her, and a prop couch that was rigged to smolder and burst into flames when she sat on it and undressed.

Blaze Starr wowed men in clubs across the country. She carried on with the Mayor of Philadelphia, Frank Rizzo.

Starr is perhaps best known for her long affair with Earl Long, the Governor of Louisiana, which was dramatized in the 1989 movie, *Blaze*, starring Paul Newman.

Considered by many as one of the top ten pioneers of striptease in America, Blaze Starr retired and ended up buying the Two O' Clock Club, which she still owns and manages today.
